XIV s. in. A **florilegium** with extracts from Ovid, Horace, Juvenal, Claudian, Avianus, Virgil, Lucan, Ps.-Cato, Pamphilus, Prudentius, the *Thebaid* and *Achilleid*, Maximianus, Theodulus, and Persius

Parchment, written by an Italian hand. Two columns of 52 lines, ruled horizontally and vertically in ink; prickings visible. Catchwords are contemporary and correspond.

DECORATION: Nine-line initials in ink. Alternating red and blue initials and flourishes.

a. 131ra–32ra: an index of the rubrics of the florilegium, *inc.* Incipiunt capitula in florum auctorum sequitur primo de. A. De abstinentia rerum etc. De auxilio. De Amore... *exp.* De uelocitate et uelocibus et fuga.

b. 132ra–34ra: another index of the rubrics of the florilegium, *inc.* Primo. De nouo inceptore alicuius rei et de difficili mutacione uite et omnia prograuant facienda uel e contro. Contra illos qui aliorum laudes uel facta sibi usurpant uel aliorum nobilitate suam ignobilitatem palliant. De fame... *exp.* De confirmacione alicuius operis uel propositi uel uerbi uel uite et huiusmodi. Expliciu[n]t capitula huius libri, incipit execusio.

This list is distinguished from a. only by a two-line initial.

b. 141ra–193ra: the florilegium, *inc.* De nouo inceptore alicuius rei et de difficili mutacione uite et omnia prograuant facienda uel e contro. Et labore est ima tempora prima... *exp.* anchora de prora iacitur stant litora puppes. Expliciu[n]t flores auctorum.

Florilegium 5. The text follows the second list of rubrics; marginal Roman numerals correlate the two.

The Statius citations that I have been able to locate are: *Theb.* 9.280 (bis, *sub rub.*: De morte et mortuis); *Ach.* 1.167–68 (*sub rub.*: De leticia); *Theb.* 8.320 (*sub rub.*: De moribus et legibus); *Theb.* 1.32–33 (*sub rub.*: De captanda alicuius beneuolencia).

c. 193rb: a list of the authors included in the florilegium, *tit.* Hii sunt flores auctorum subscriptorum per concordancias

Our author is listed as “Stacii Achilleydos, Thebaydos.”

Sankt Florian

Note: In his *Haus-Chronik* (Hamburg, 1822, 196), Andreas Wilhelm Cramer notes that there are five *codices* of Statius in Sankt Florian. The handwritten catalogs in the Stiftsbibliothek, including that of Michael Ziegler, who was Cramer’s host, list only two manuscripts. A search of other collections in the area yielded no additional copies, and I assume that Cramer’s statement is an error or a misprint.
